What is happening & what to look out for this Spring



Our gardener Anthony Butler reveals some of the things you can look out for in Stroud's parks between May and June

- Planting is planned for the new 'woodland' (library) bed in Bank Gardens.
- New planting is also planned along the back wall of Park Gardens. A fantastic spot in full sun. Let's see what we can grow.
- The new summer bedding scheme for 2011 will be installed from the end of May. Last year we had great success with begonias. Many people commented on the vibrant colours and their long-lasting and repeated flowering late into November. As a result they will again form the bulk of this year's colour scheme, which is within the spectrum of the rainbow, as chosen by Stroud in Bloom.

NOW AT THEIR BEST

Plants to look out for in Bank Gardens:

Bulbs: Erythroniums, Alliums and Camassias.

Herbaceous: Primulas and Ajugas.

Shrubs: Osmanthus (scented), Choisya (scented) and Viburnum (scented).

Trees: Limes.



Plants to look out for in Park Gardens:

Bulbs: Snake head fritillary, Turk's cap lily, Wood anemone and Blue bell.

Herbaceous: Pulsatilla (pasque flower).

Shrubs: Mock orange (philadelphus).

Trees: Malus (crab apple).
