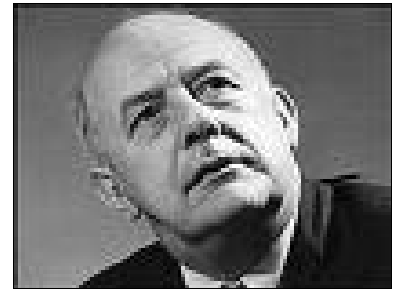


A Passion for Churches and Moore...

We aim to explore Betjeman's 'passion for churches' with film, prose and poetry as well as visiting some of the Gloucestershire churches he admired. These will include Holy Innocents at Highnam, Gloucester Cathedral (where a light lunch in the historic Parliament Room is planned) and All Saints, Uplands, in whose parish Hawkwood stands.

All Saints, an Edwardian Church designed by Temple Moore, is celebrating its centenary in 2010. The course includes an evening celebration at the church on **Thursday 21st October** featuring music, drama and poetry in honour of Temple Moore and the parish of Uplands – all within the context of 'the bonus of laughter'!

Hawkwood is a lovely, welcoming venue set in a Grade II listed Cotswold country house with home cooking and beautiful views.

Course leaders: Jonathan Stedall, BBC film director and author, friend of John Betjeman and a Vice President of The Betjeman Society; and Pamela Tawse, a knowledgeable local resident.
