Description

A three-storey building with a shop on the ground floor. Built in the late 19th century, it replaced an earlier building.

The top floor features a decorated dormer window. The first floor is faced in brick and features a stone venetian window with stone decorations. Attached to the brick is an old-style lantern.

The shopfront on the ground floor is in traditional style. It features pilasters, corbels, a central recessed doorway and a stallriser.

Age	Built in the late 19th century on the site of a former building. It features in a photo from 1900, but not in one from 1885.
Architectural and aesthetic value	A handsome frontage with fine, decorated windows. The shop front is well preserved.
Degree of completeness	Original exterior.
