Description

Two-storey building, constructed circa 1900, comprising a shop with a flat above. The upper floor is built of brick and features a stone Venetian sash window and stone quoins. The shop front is in a traditional style, with a three panels of coloured glass above, positioned horizontally above the shop name.

Originally part of No.50 on the corner (The Shoe Box), and probably had a gable facing the High Street. Rebuilt in the late 19th century.
