<p>Description</p> <p>A very fine three storey brick terrace forming the whole east side of Kendrick street between High Street and Threadneedle Street. The upper floors have terracotta Renaissance enrichments continuing around both ends into High Street and Threadneedle Street. Separate rear access from Kendrick Lane. Built as offices and shops for Holloway Bros., 1877, by William Clissold. Selection Criteria	
Rarity	Only example of Victorian terracotta decoration in Stroud.
Architectural and aesthetic value	Handsome and largely complete terrace of shops and offices (now flats).
Group value	The whole terrace was designed and built as a whole and retains many original features,
Historic association	Associated with local businessman, politician and philanthropist, George Holloway.
Degree of completeness	Original design largely complete, especially on upper two storeys.
Date of inclusion	June 2017
