Historic building	Conservation Area: Stroud Town Centre
Public house, now closed	List entry number SLHA0038



Description

The three-storey Market Tavern building was constructed after 1819, when Union Street was built to join High Street to London Road.

It has an ashlar stone frontage onto London Road and Union Street, and a rendered one onto Cornhill. There are sash windows on all upper floors. A large stone extension has sash windows to the rear.

Selection Criteria	
Age	A late Georgian building, constructed after 1819
Architectural and aesthetic value	Originally the London Road frontage was part of a terrace of four houses extending towards Cornhill
Social and communal value	The pub was renamed the Market Tavern in 2012. It had previously been the much loved Pelican Inn, and prior to that the Union Inn. It had the last 'Men Only' bar in Stroud until the 1970s. Currently closed and unoccupied
Date of inclusion	June 2017
